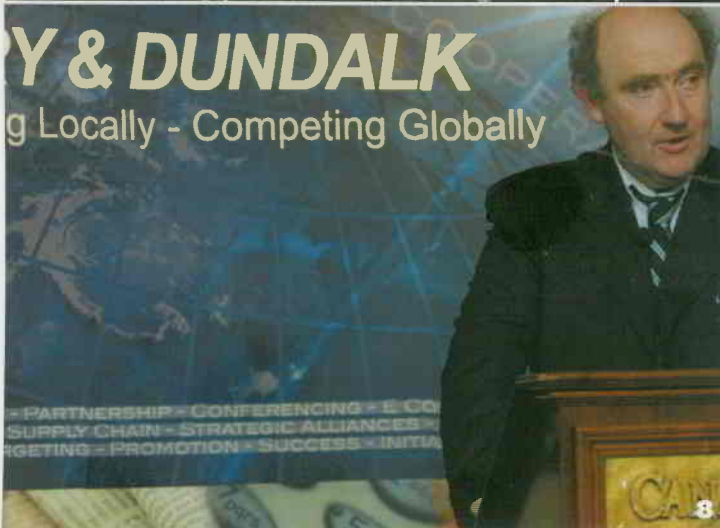


TRADE EXPO 2004
